Fed up with the continuing violence and racism in America, Hugh and Keryl, a Black couple with two teenage children, decide that it is time to leave the country. Spurred on by the presidential election of 2016, they begin to make plans to move to Hugh's ancestral home, the island of Barbados. The family's search for a space where there is a Black majority, Black leadership and Black power has been ongoing, taking them to and thru Atlanta Georgia, where the dangers of the day become apparent to Xavian, their son, as he joins the protests in the "Black Lives Matter" Movement, after he is the victim of a racially motivated attack. Barbados will be their final move as each struggle with identity, place and purpose. Preparations for the move take much longer than anticipated, and the family find themselves making their move in the middle of a pandemic and with a pending second term of Donald J. Trump. Feeling the urgency of the moment, they wind up in quarantine on the island as they navigate the cultural, economic, educational and generational shifts that they encounter.

Will they be able to embrace the expatriate life? Will Xavian and his sister Maya successfully meet the challenges of their coming-of-age story as Bajans? Will their "Yankee" culture have a negative impact on friends and family. Will they fight, or fly to the next potential homeplace in England or Canada where once again they will be in the minority?

The family dreams of the Bajan past and the Barbadian future, each dreaming of their legacy and their future. Led by the lost souls of enslaved Africans, heroes of the slave revolts and flying fish, they confront their own PTSD (Post Traumatic Slave Disorder). They embrace their legacy and each one finds his/her way home. Through musical soundscapes, traditional music and contemporary song, we journey with them as they travel homeward.

Linda Parris-Bailey creates story-based plays with music focusing on themes of transformation and empowerment. She is President and CEO of Parris-Bailey Arts, Inc., and former Executive/Artistic Director of The Carpetbag Theatre, Inc of Knoxville, TN. During her fifty-year career as a playwright, she has written and performed numerous works. Linda is a 2019 Creative Capital Awardee and recipient of a 2015 Doris Duke Artists Award in Theater. Her award-winning works include, *Speed Killed My Cousin* and *Between A Ballad and A Blues*, her ode to Appalachian renaissance man Howard “Louie Bluié” Armstrong. Her signature work *Dark Cowgirls and Prairie Queens* continues to be performed. Linda is a founding member of Alternate ROOTS and a Senior Advisor to the Women Playwrights International Conference. Her works have been published in *Alternate ROOTS: Plays from the Southern Theater*, *Ensemble Works*, and other anthologies of contemporary plays. She recently completed the new work *Flushing (Make Room for Someone Else)*, an adult puppet piece, in collaboration with Eric Bass and Ines Zeller-Bass of Sandglass Theater, directed by Kathie DeNobriga. The piece centers on generational transitions in leadership, race, and culture. This is the International Premier of her latest solo work, *Yankee Bajan*.



Dahlak Brathwaite

Director

Dahlak Brathwaite, is an award-winning dramatic auteur: playwright, composer, performer, director, and filmmaker. His work has been presented at The Smithsonian, Brooklyn Academy of Music, The Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, REDCAT, MCA Chicago, Ars Nova, The Public Theater, The Apollo, SXSW, by Creative Time, and on HBO’s last two seasons of *Russell Simmons Presents Def Poetry*. Dahlak’s trilogy of works - *Spiritrials* (solo play), *Try/Step/Trip* (musical), *Adapting History* (documentary film) - take a personal look into the criminal justice system and the relationship between Black American music and Black American subjugation. Development of the work has been supported by CalArts, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Victory Gardens, and Montalvo Arts Center. Dahlak has received awards and support from NEFA, the Doris Duke Foundation, The U.S. State Department, NYU Tisch, and MAP Fund. He was a Creative Capital finalist and a United States Artist nominee. Most recently, Dahlak was invited by The Public Theatre’s Under the Radar Festival to join their 2023 Devised Writing Group. He is a graduate of NYU’s Graduate Musical Theatre Writing Program, where he was awarded the Dean’s Full-Tuition Fellowship, and served as the Assistant Director for the national tour of the Tony-winning revival of *Oklahoma*.

She founded the Diaspora Vibe Cultural Arts Incubator (DVCAI) to serve as a local and global laboratory dedicated to promoting, nurturing and cultivating the vision and diverse talents of emerging artists from the Caribbean Diaspora,

artists of color and immigrant artists. Twenty-six years later, DVCAI is recognized as a global resource and one of the region's leading platforms dedicated to providing diaspora artists with a venue to explore and experiment with new forms and themes that challenge traditional definitions of the Caribbean and Latin American art. Her awards include the Knight Foundation Cultural Award, The African Heritage Cultural Arts Center Third Annual Calabash Amadlozi Visual Arts Award, International Businesswoman of the Year, One of South Florida's 50 Most Powerful Black Professionals to name a few. In 2021, she was recognized by the Perez Art Museum Miami's International Women's Committee as International Woman of the Year.



Izia Lindsay, M.F.A

Graphic Designer

Izia Lee Lindsay is a mixed media artist who explores with both digital and traditional media. His artwork addresses symbolism in Caribbean iconography that is rooted in tradition but interpreted with contemporary ideas. Lindsay uses bold, geometric shapes that juxtapose and intersperse to form his multilayered artistic pieces. The thematic whole is a cultural narrative reproducing the dualities of his turbulent, cosmopolitan, Caribbean life. His research examines material culture, indigenous

societies and the ever-changing landscape of the Caribbean while his subject matter tackles issues of identity and class in a post-colonial society. Lindsay is currently a lecturer in Miami, Fla.



Dr. H. Stefan Walcott

Soundscape and Music Director

Stefan Walcott is a performer and a young academic with a focus on the popular music of the English-speaking Caribbean. Stefan has a PhD in Cultural Studies from the University of the West Indies Cave Hill and currently lectures part-time at the University of the West Indies. He also tutors at the Barbados Community College, where he teaches Caribbean Music, Music History and runs the Caribbean Music Ensemble. Stefan has self-published three books, 60 Caribbean Folk Songs, 20 Bajan folks

and Caribbean Composer's Handbook, which is being used in the education system in Barbados. He also has the only blog on Caribbean Music, www.stefanwalcott.com, which discusses music and culture. Stefan also leads a unique musical ensemble called the 1688 Collective, which has a not-for-profit arm called 1688 Dingolay Inc., which focuses on group childhood music education. Stefan has also created Handel's Caribbean Messiah, an original re-working of Handel's Messiah for using Caribbean folk and popular culture as well as led Barbados' national delegation to Carifesta. Stefan is currently director of the University of the West Indies Big Band.



Russell Watson, M.F.A

Media and Set Designer

Russell Watson is an artist and educator working in theater and digital imaging. He studied Drama in Education and Theatre Arts at the Edna Manley College in Jamaica and Film, Video and New Media at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. He has been Curator of Art and Media at Chicago's historic Hot House Center for Performing Art and Youth Program Coordinator at New York's Studio Museum in Harlem. His feature film *A Hand Full of Dirt* won the 2011 ReelWorld Film Festival Audience Award and was nominated for the 2011 Pan African Film Festival's Best First Feature Director Award. He is currently a Lecturer in Film in the Faculty of Culture Creative and Performing Arts at UWI Cave Hill and runs RSTUDIO - a multimedia workshop (est 2010) that offers digital imaging services to a diverse client base including corporate entities, government agencies, theatre companies, fine artists and academics.
